Fabio Giomi is CNRS researcher at the *Centre d'études turques, ottomanes, balkaniques et centrasiatiques* (CETOBaC, EHESS) in Paris, France. His research focuses on the social and cultural history of Southeastern Europe between the late-nineteenth and mid-twentieth centuries, with a special focus on the Yugoslav region. Among his current research topics are voluntary associations and social movements, women and gender history, Balkan Muslims, transnational studies. He is the author of *Making Muslim Women European. Voluntary Associations, Gender and Islam in Post-Ottoman Bosnia and Yugoslavia* (CEU Press, under press). He also co-edited the book *Kemalism. Transnational Politics in the Post-Ottoman World* (I.B. Tauris, 2019) and the journal issues *Gendering the (post-)Ottoman world* (Clio. Women, Gender, History, Volume 48, Issue 2, 2018) and *Voluntary Associations in Yugoslavia, 1918-1941* (European Review of History, Special Issue, 26, 1, 2019).
